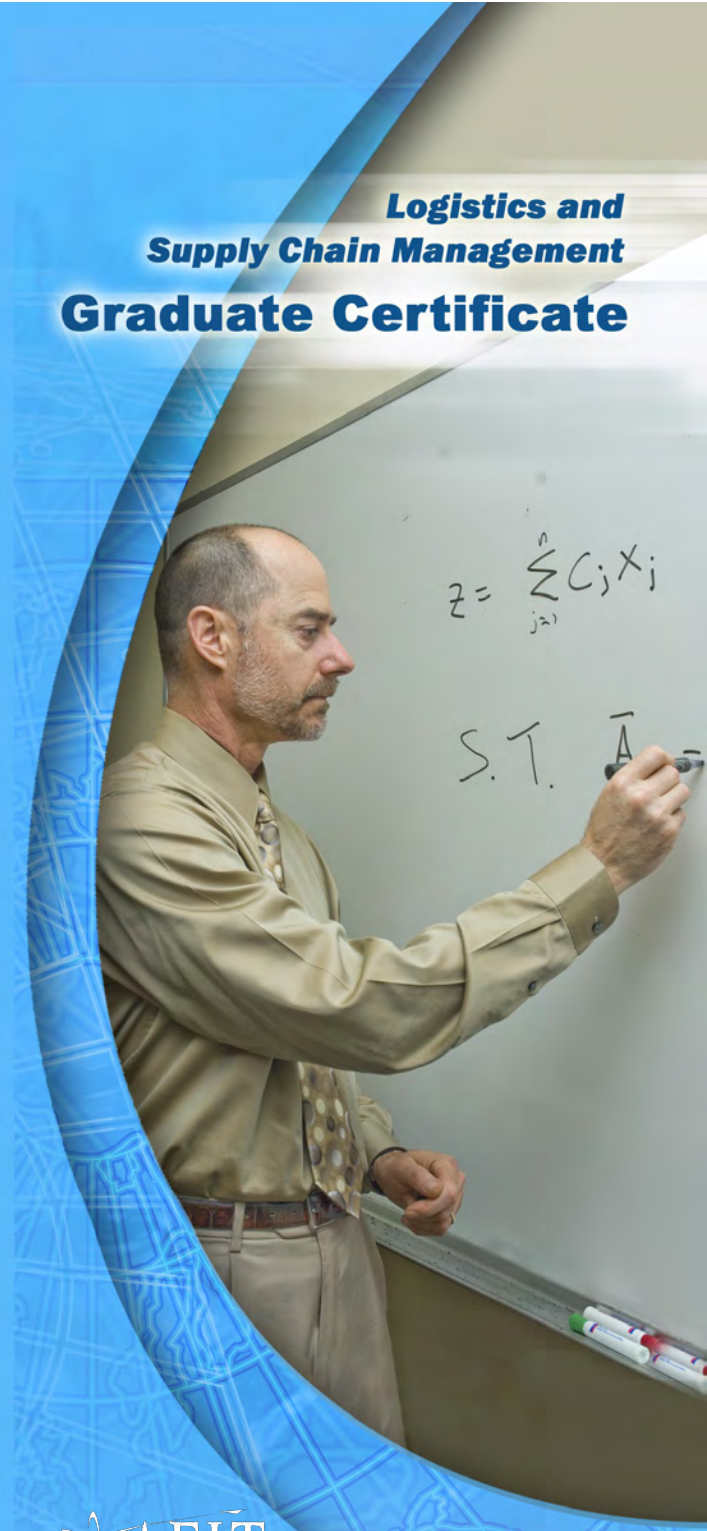

Provides students with graduate level education in the fundamentals of Supply Chain Management, with particular emphasis on Department of Defense (DoD) and Air Force specific applications.

Objectives:

- Educate Supply Chain professionals in the fundamental aspects of the field
- Introduce state-of-the-art analytical and problem solving techniques for Supply Chain managers



Courses

The Graduate Certificate in Supply Chain Management consists of five graduate-level courses taken sequentially via Distance Learning over a period of 15 months.

Courses:

- Introduction to Supply Chain Management
- Lean Operations Management
- Applied Statistical Data Analysis
- Quantitative Modeling
- Strategic Sourcing

Target Audience

This program targets acquisition and logistics professionals. It is normally funded by the student's sponsoring organization, and begins each January. Program admission is restricted to current DoD employees only and requires both academic acceptance and agreement on the organizational funding mechanism, with exceptions on a case-by-case basis only.

AFIT is fully accredited — courses transfer directly to our Master of Science degree and are transferable to most public and private universities, as applicable.
