

Cyberspace 200: Cyber Application Fact Sheet

Description: Cyberspace 200 is a Professional Continuing Education (PCE) course presented at the Secret level for the deliberate development of cyberspace professionals at the 6-11 year point of their careers. Students' career experience and training are leveraged with course curriculum to enhance their understanding of cyber system acquisition, capabilities, limitations and vulnerabilities so they can better plan, direct, and execute defensive and offensive cyberspace operations at the operational level of war while integrating with air and space operations. (Cyber 200 is not an introductory course.)

Eligibility Criteria for Cyberspace Professionals:

Officer: Level 1 Cyberspace Professional, TAFCSO of 6-8 years; minimum 24 months cyber experience

Enlisted: Level 1 Cyberspace Professional; TSgt/TSgt selects regardless of year group; SSgts with a TAFMSD of 9-11 years; minimum 48 months cyber experience (TSgt cross-trainees must have a minimum of 24 months cyberspace experience)

Civilian: GS-11 through GS-13 in cyberspace ops or acquisition positions; minimum 24 months cyber experience

Selection (Active Duty AF):

- SCPMO establishes student quotas for classes and generates the list of eligible candidates and sends a course announcement to appropriate organizations
- Organizations deconflict their eligible candidates against class dates and return their list (prioritized order of candidates with preferred class dates) to the SCPMO
- SCPMO populates classes with an initial load and posts rosters to the SCPMO website
- AF CyTCoE sends a course notification (Welcome Packet) to students approximately 60 days prior to class start
- Individual requests to change or cancel class dates must have wing commander (or equivalent) authorization

Selection (Reserves and Guard):

- SCPMO establishes quota for ARC positions
- POCs nominate personnel for courses
